Columbia

The **Tunnel to Towers Foundation 5K Walk & Run** is in Columbia on **Friday, September 9, 2022** with a start time of **6 p.m.** Participants meet ahead of the 5K at the Columbia Convention Center. According to the Tunnel to Towers website, the series “was created to honor the heroic life and death of Stephen Siller, a New York City firefighter (FDNY) who lost his life on September 11, 2001 after strapping on his gear and running through the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel to the Twin Towers.” [Register for Tunnel to Towers in Columbia.](#)

Greenville City is hosting a National Fallen Firefighters Foundation **9/11 Memorial Stair Climb** on **Saturday, September 10 from 7 a.m.-3 p.m. at Fluor Field** on Main Street. The NFFF stair climb is “a way to honor and remember the FDNY firefighters who selflessly gave their lives so that others might live on September 11, 2001. Each participant pays tribute to a FDNY firefighter by climbing the equivalent of the 110 stories of the World Trade Center. FCC issues PSA

The [Federal Communications Commission issued an announcement](#) to remind cell phone users that 3G technology is being phased out of service in favor of improved technology and that users with cell phones, medical alert systems, or other devices that use 3G may want to consider upgrading before 3G is unavailable.

This is important because **you can't call 911** without a carrier connection.

In its announcement, the FCC stated “mobile carriers are shutting down their 3G networks, which rely on older technology, to make room for more advanced network services, including 5G. As a result, many older cell phones will be unable to make or receive calls and texts, **including calls to 911**, or use data services.”
