Hornet Fire Training donates guidon holder in memory of J Muller to Fire Officer Academy

The Officers Section hosted its third **Fire Officer Academy: The Company Officer** in early October. The first-ever graduating class of the program, 22-01, joined forces shortly after their graduation and decided to give back to the program that reignited their passion for the job and gave them an extended family. The guidon pole that they gifted is stunning and carries with it the significance of alumni remaining active in the ever-growing alumni network.

Emergency services and the military have many similar themes intertwined in their cultures. The Fire Officer Academy has roots in the military, specifically the Noncommissioned Officer Academy (NCO). The NCO Academy is the second level of Enlisted Professional Military Education and prepares those enlisted with managing and leading units. The design and intentionality of the FOA draws inspiration from the NCOA. The tradition of a guidon also stems from the military.

The guidon pole donated by 22-01 follows each Fire Officer Academy class from place to place throughout the week. On the pole is the actual guidon, a flag that companies carry to identify their unit. Each class has had a guidon that details their graduating year and class number. Every classmate signs the guidon at the end of the week, and this is gifted to the recipient of the David Lee Crenshaw Leadership Award. The guidon is important to the culture of the Fire Officer Academy.

Jonah Smith, Battalion Chief at Charlotte Fire and man behind Hornet Fire Training, is an integral piece of the Fire Officer Academy puzzle. Chief Smith has taught for the Association on numerous occasions, and the South Carolina fire services loves his Hand in Hand Enjin course. The Hornet Fire Training cadre has been part of the Fire Officer Academy since its first program, bonding with the students and other instructors.

Jonah and his cadre taught **J Muller**, graduate of FOA 23-01. J was killed in the line of duty on May 26, 2023, just a few short months after his time in the Fire Officer Academy. To attempt to put into words the impact J's life and legacy have had on the program is futile; there are just simply not enough catchy phrases and no words meaningful enough to do it justice. Losing J not only impacted his fellow FOA 23-01 classmates, but the instructors he met throughout the journey, too.

When it was time for FOA 23-02 to do engine work, the Hornet Fire cadre donated a guidon holder in memory of James "J" Michael Muller, FOA 23-01.

Jonah shared on social media about the donation, stating, "The last time this class was offered, a man named James Michael Muller was in class. As many know, he was killed in the Line of Duty a few short months later... Through the generosity of Elkhart Brass and Jamie Fulk, we were able to create an awesome remembrance and gift to honor Jay," he wrote.

"It was a true honor for our cadre to present this remembrance to the staff and facilitators of this excellent school," Jonah concluded.

The gift from Hornet Fire Training is a testament to J's impact on everyone who had the pleasure of knowing him and is a physical reminder of his lasting legacy on the foundation of the Fire Officer Academy.

Thank you, Jonah and cadre, for your continued brotherhood and support of the Fire Officer Academy and the Association.

Welcome To The Team in Voisine Kim joins the South Carolina State Firefighters' Association after 25 years at John Deere in Maine

Welcome to the team, Kim!

As the needs of the South Carolina fire service grow, so does the need for additional Association staff to continue to serve our membership at a high level. We're excited to welcome Kim Voisine to the team as our Administrative Assistant.

We spoke with Kim for a quick interview to introduce her you.

What is your connection to the fire service?

In 1996 I started working as a volunteer driver for Poland Fire Rescue in Poland Maine. I resigned from the department in 2003 when I was expecting my second child. I had missed and wanted to get back into the fire service. In 2014 I returned to Poland Fire Rescue as a driver, completed Advanced Driving Courses and Pumps class to be able to drive the ambulances and engines. In winter of 2014 I completed my Basic EMT Class and became a Nationally Registered EMT in the State of Maine. In 2019 I completed my Firefighter I/II Pro-Board for the State of Maine Firefighter I/II from Southern Maine Community College.

Where did you work previously?

I've worked for John Deere for the past 25 years. I started out answering the phones and worked my way up within the company, learning all that I could about parts, sales and service. In my career with John Deere, I spent 18 years in the Construction and Forestry division, 7 years in the Agricultural and Turf division, and was the Service Manager for the local John Deere dealership.

Why are you passionate about the fire service?

I'm passionate about helping people. As a firefighter I help people on their worst days. Whether it's because there is an auto accident or a house fire as a firefighter, I'm one of the passionate few that run toward the danger and those that need help the most.

Our Chief at Poland Fire Rescue was retiring and at his retirement party he said in his speech something that I passionately believe to be true... "an individual that has a passion to become a firefighter has something unique within them, it can't be bottled and sold. It's not something that you can teach or learn, it's something that you have or don't. It's something deep within the person's core."

What are you most excited about in your move to South Carolina?

Starting my new job with the South Carolina State Firefighters' Association and the warmer weather. Maine is a beautiful state but the Maine winters with its snow, ice and very cold temperatures for 5 to 6 months a year can be challenging and make the winters the longest season of the year.

What are your hobbies?

I haven't had any real hobbies in quite a while. When I'm not working for John Deere, I spend my free time working for or at Poland Fire Rescue either picking up an open shift on a Sunday, training, working on fundraiser events or working as the treasures for the Benevolent Association. My husband says Poland Fire Rescue is my "hobby."

What do you want the South Carolina fire service to know about you?

I'm looking forward to getting the opportunity to meet and work with everyone within the South Carolina fire service. My husband, our two dogs and I are very excited about moving to South Carolina and making it our home. We have two adult children. Our son Brandon, his wife Lela and grandson Charlie that live in Westbrook, Maine and our daughter Amber that lives in St. Louis, Missouri. They're all looking forward to visiting us in South Carolina.
