How to join the PeerConnect App

May is Mental Health Awareness Month and we at the South Carolina State Firefighters' Association invite you to join the **South Carolina Public Safety Wellness Initiative**.

A joint effort between the Association, South Carolina First Responder Assistance and Support Team, South Carolina EMS Association, and South Carolina Law Enforcement Assistance Program, the SC Public Safety Wellness Initiative proactively connects every member in your organization with their peer team for structured mental health and wellness conversations through the **PeerConnect App**.

The app allows for scheduled regular interval conversations (customizable for all your members or on a per group basis), and connects with those who do not actively seek out support to reduce the stigma and normalize mental health conversations.

Last call for Cleveland School anniversary RSVPs

Cleveland School was a rural South Carolina school, situated just a few miles east of Camden, that was constructed circa 1908-1909. Prior to the fire, nearly 100 students were enrolled at the school. The fire occurred during the annual play on May 17, 1923, and signified the end of the school year. 77 people lost their lives due to the Cleveland School fire. This fire impacted local, state, and national codes regarding school safety.

In a joint effort between the Association, Camden Fire, Lugoff Fire, Kershaw County Fire, and Beulah Church, a recognition service will be held on Wednesday, May 17 at 10 a.m. at the memorial site with processional to follow to the mass grave site. A historical seminar will be held the evening before on Tuesday, May 16 at 6 p.m. detailing the impact the fire had on the community and state. Please kindly RSVP if you plan to attend either of both events.

Today, May 11, is **Sine Die** for the South Carolina legislature, signifying adjournment for the year. Only legislation expressly identified in the Sine Die Resolution can be considered or acted upon beyond this date. Bills filed this session have until Sine Die next year to be signed into law.
