Origins of "Rattle Watch"



Rattle Watch is the Association's newest method of communicating

You've probably wondered where 'rattle watch' came from and why it's the name of this newsletter.

The term 'rattle watch' dates back to Colonial America and refers to a group of volunteers who would patrol the streets at night carrying large wooden rattles. If a fire was seen, the men spun the rattles, then directed the responding citizens to form bucket brigades. *In other words, this 'rattle watch' communicated important information to the community it served*. The Association's goal with the newsletter falls in line with the duties this group and, thus, was dubbed Rattle Watch.
