

Meet the 77th President of the Association: Malcolm Burns

<u>Malcolm Burns</u>, Deputy Chief at Dorchester County Fire Rescue, was sworn in as the 77th President of the South Carolina State Firefighters' Association at the conclusion of Fire-Rescue on June 17, 2023. President Burns follows immediate Past President Josh Holzheimer, Deputy Chief at City of Greer.

"As a small town fire chief, I knew what I knew to keep my department running... I would've never guessed that, this short time later, I would be standing here in this position talking to you folks. Don't set limits on yourself," President Burns said during his incoming remarks.

President Burns thanked his family, chief, and friends for their support over his time serving on the Executive Committee and gave a brief summary of his goals for his Presidency.

"We have a dire issue that is plaguing all aspects of public safety," President Burns continued, "and that's getting people... My goal this year is to start an ad-hoc committee on recruitment and retention."


132 departments awarded FireSafe designation

132 fire departments were rewarded for their community risk reduction efforts during the Fire Safe South Carolina designation ceremony at Fire-Rescue. These communities continually work to reduce fire-related injuries, promote consistent fire safety messaging, and stress the importance of providing all relative data collected at fire scenes.

"Nearly one million citizens were educated last year on ways to stay fire safe thanks to the commitment and dedication of our 132 Fire Safe South Carolina fire departments and our community partners," South Carolina State Fire Marshal CRR Section Chief Josh Fulbright said in the Fire Safe SC <u>press release</u>. "The efforts will not stop there as we continue to work together to educate more people and make South Carolina fire safe."

Officer Academy Class 23-02

The Fire Officer Academy: The Company Officer is an intense program not designed for the complacent. The Company Officer tests students in ways they haven't been tested since they joined the fire service, leaving a lasting impression on the trajectory of their career and the camaraderie between students creates a lifelong family. The Company Officer takes you back to the basics while addressing the issues you face as a leader in your department.

Note that an application is required, including a resume, cover letter, and letter from the applicant's Chief. Applicants do not need to be a member of the South Carolina State Firefighters' Association Officers Section but membership with the Officers Section is preferred. Applications will be vetted prior to being accepted into the program and will be sent precourse assignments to be completed prior to final selection. The Fire Officer Academy is limited to 25 people. Cost is \$125.

Applications are due June 30, 2023.
