


Submit your award nominations!

FSIC course spotlight: Lithium Ion Battery Fires Response

The Lithium-Ion Battery Fires Response course during Fire Service Improvement Conference covers several types of batteries and modules, and students will delve into the mitigation concerns and techniques when fires occur. Throughout the course, you will witness demonstrations of lithium-ion battery fires and learn about different techniques of extinguishment.

Contamination problems and cancer concerns in the fire service will be addressed, and different real-world techniques that can help limit and mitigate these contamination hazards will be demonstrated.

The goal is to provide students with a better understanding of lithium-ion battery applications, fire mitigation techniques, and a general understanding of the cancer problem in the fire service, along with ways to reduce contamination. We will also present up-to-date and ongoing research on lithium-ion battery incidents and how they relate to our protective clothing.

Dues, Voting Members, + Forms reminder

Association membership dues invoices were mailed last month, but that's not the only administrative task departments must complete in order to remain in Good Standing with the Association.

The due date for your department's Association membership dues invoice is **January 1, 2024**. In addition, **Voting Members must be selected by January 1, 2024**, in accordance with the by-law changes voted and approved by your delegates at the 2020 Fire-Rescue Conference.

Forms 206 and 207 are due midnight on January 31, 2024 on the Association's Member Management System (MMS). Your department's Profile & Statistician Report Form 101 should also be completed within the MMS. All forms must be completed no later than midnight January 31, 2024, for your department to remain a member in good standing with the Association. If we do not receive the forms by the deadline, your department will jeopardize their Firemen's Insurance & Inspection Fund distribution and the loss of Association Member Benefits.
